

Bassetlaw Satellite Club

Bassetlaw District Orienteering Club recently celebrated its first birthday after starting in June 2009. The club was created with the help of Bassetlaw Sports Development, East Retford Rugby Club, the East Midlands Orienteering Association and Nottinghamshire Orienteering Club to build on the local interest in orienteering that in many cases originated from Bramcote Lorne School, in Gamston, near Retford.

The club holds a weekly club night on a Wednesday evening, 6.30pm until 8.00pm. Throughout the winter the club meetings were based at Ranby House School who kindly allowed one of their gymnasiums to be used as a base for night orienteering.

During the summer months, club nights are being held at various locations to take advantage of the good local areas we have around Bassetlaw. We have three qualified coaches and cater for all ages and abilities. Families are very welcome as well as interested individuals.

The juniors have enjoyed a very successful year with two Firsts and two Runners-Up at the East Midlands Orienteering Championships. Good performances have also led to five Bassetlaw juniors being selected to represent the East Midlands at the Junior Inter Regional Championships, in South Wales and one being selected to join the M14 Regional Squad tour to Scotland, in the Summer.

The adults and families have also enjoyed a very busy year and have attended the Scottish 6 Days event, many urban races, the International JK Festival, the British Championships as well as many Local and National events.

To further their orienteering experience three of the Bassetlaw juniors have joined the East Midlands Junior Squad Summer tour to Sweden.

Cairngorm Talent Training Camp 2010

After being injured in the run-up to the major selection races this year and having what I perceived to be average races, I was pleasantly suprised to be

selected for the Talent Coaching Camp organised by BOF. 2010 has seen a change in the junior system within British Orienteering with the introduction of Talent and Acadamy levels, and with the whole selection system being based on ability not age and percentage time behind the winner in each race. Due to this, the camp that I attended had an age range from 15-20 which worked out better than I would have predicted.

After missing out on summer tour selection last year I felt that my technical ability had not improved in a while however the week this summer definitely changed that.

Although I was planning to write an original and slightly different article, I would actually like to share some of the main things that I learnt with you, because I am hoping that that will significantly change my orienteering for the better.

The first thing that we focussed on, which I have never come across before is the concept of 'remarkable features' and picking them out when planning each leg. The basic idea links back to simplifying and it is about picking out the large, obvious features on each leg and, in general, using compass and these features to guide you into the control, rather than picking off every small vegetation change or rock feature.

Another session we did focussed on leg planning and simplifying and to do this we had to look at the map quickly, pick out the remarkable features and contact points on the leg and then set off. Whilst on the legs (which were between 500-600m) we were only allowed to look at the map 3 or 4 times. The result was that I was running much faster, not faster than I am capable of but faster than I normally would whilst racing. The conclusion was that nearly everyone looks at the map more than necessary on the run, and precise map contact is only needed after the attack point has been reached. To conclude the week we had a sprint race around the nearby Lagganlia complex, with a JWOC style quarantine and a chance to put all the things we had learnt into practice. Although a sprint is not 'classic' orienteering, I think that it was a good way to put to the main things into practice because sprint races are all about choosing a route quickly, executing it with speed and then using fine navigation towards the end of the leg. My confidence increased dramatically after coming 2nd in the race and made me believe that I had learnt and consolidated many new skills.

I hope that some of these tips will help everyone in the club to essentially become better orienteers and maybe encourage some juniors to aspire to be selected for summer tours.

I would like to thank NOC for helping me to fund the trip and for assisting me in learning so much. Hopefully my results for the club next year will prove how helpful the week was.

NOC Winter League 2010 / 2011

The format of the Winter League (and Summer League) events was discussed in some detail at the most recent Committee Meeting. The advent of SI punching means that it should be possible to create more challenging courses on our smaller areas, thus obviating the need to include a score section as part of the Technical course. The fact that a significant number of older members would like a technical challenge but not a physical challenge means that it would be preferable to provide two technical courses, labelled short and long. To minimise work for the planner it is suggested that the first section of the long course is the same as, or very similar to, the majority of the short course. However, the Committee would like to maintain the number of courses offered at four. In view of the lower numbers attempting the white and yellow courses it is suggested that they are combined. Hence the four courses would as follows.

Course	Length	Equivalent to
Introductory	1.5 to 2.5 km	White / Yellow
Medium	2.5 to 3.5 km	Orange
Short Technical	3.5 to 4.5 km	
Long Technical	4.5 to 6.0 km

Helen Palmer and the 2010 WOC Long Distance Final

Helen says: I made it to the WOC long distance final after a super safe race, taking at times laughably safe routes and thanking the stars (/ planner Johan Ivarsson) that for once I got the "easy" first control and the "easy" 10th control.

What people say to you before a qualifier:-

Treat it like any other race You don't need to do anything special You are good enough if you just avoid big mistakes

And my favourite: Just enjoy it!

This is all great advice, if you are a robot. Actually the last one does work for me, when I get nervous I remind myself that orienteering is not who I am but just something I do, something I supposedly love doing. But the truth is if you aren't a robot and you are anything like me (and especially if you have screwed up qualifiers / selection races in the past) treating it like any other race is almost impossible, it's the World Champs, you have worked very hard for one chance and you know it. It affects your sleep, you struggle to eat and when you warm up your stomach is churning and your legs feel like lead.

Advice that does work: anything focused on the actual orienteering technique, which is the only thing that really matters. Toni Louhisola our coach is very good at helping me get focused on what I'm actually going to do.

I spoke to my personal coach Jon Musgrave by phone several times before the qualifier (the night before and before I went to get on the bus to the start, when you aren't allowed phones). He would never say treat it like any other race, he *knows* the feelings. He told me that when I make a small mistake (which you almost certainly will do) I should say hello to the control when I saw it, to calm me down and bring a smile to my face. I was so terrified round the whole course that I said a grateful hello to every single control.

Terror, relief x 12 + JOY as I crossed the finish line. Satisfied, job done.

It was ugly orienteering, I can't say I flowed, I can't say I had masses of confidence, maybe a quiet inner confidence, the course did feel straightforward, mainly because I made it super easy with my route choices and double checks. It didn't feel like I ran hard, but I probably did for parts.

The final is a totally different beast. I had a good dress rehearsal at Verdal and I'll model my tactics on that race which was a little longer with a little more climb than tomorrows version. The passage through the arena will be stressful and probably a little different than anything I've experienced but it will be an unforgettable experience and now I've broken through a big mental barrier maybe I can *just enjoy myself?*

Chairman's Report for 2010 and Plans for Next Year

As I look back on the last year, I am pleased to be able to report substantial progress within the Club during the past twelve months.

During 2009/10, the Club has again organised a full range of events with a successful Robin Hood Trophy in February, a good range of East Midland League events throughout the year and a full summer league programme. My thanks to all of the organisers, planners and controllers for these events, I am delighted that your efforts were rewarded by the support of healthy numbers of competitors. In addition, we have made two new ventures in our fixture programme.

The first was to host a City Race around the centre of Nottingham. This inaugural event took a great deal of planning and preparation but was, I believe, a tremendous success which was extremely well supported and favourably commented upon by a wide range of participants. Furthermore, it was seen, by Nottingham City Council, as a worthwhile addition to city life which they are keen to see us repeat in future years.

The second new venture was the introduction of a local Winter League which has been intended to offer a greater availability of events for local orienteers who do not wish to travel far afield. Whilst the support for these events was a little mixed we did, I believe, learn a sufficient amount to justify launching a larger programme for the autumn and I hope that the league will be hotly contested when it begins in a couple of weeks time. After some discussion, we have now settled on a format for the Winter League events which should suit orienteers of all ages and abilities and I know that all of the Committee hope that all members will enjoy competing in the league.

A highlight of this year has been our success in securing Sport England funding to support the development of the Club. This has allowed us to retain the services of a paid Club Development Officer and purchase an impressive range of Sport Ident equipment. The project is intended to increase the frequency and quality of our events, encourage more club members to volunteer to assist with those events and to increase participation in our sport, hopefully leading to an increase in our membership. All is going well with the project so far. We are seeing a better flow of volunteers supporting our events and certainly an increase in the number of people who are trying us out for the first time. The Sport Ident equipment has arrived and has been augmented by our share of the East Midlands stock, meaning that we are now self-sufficient with Sport Ident equipment for all but the largest of competitions. My main concern now is to make the equipment as 'user friendly' as possible for the widest range of organisers and planners in order to ensure that, save in exceptional circumstances, all of our events will be supported by our Sport Ident equipment and pin punching will only be seen as the facility of absolute last resort.

The Satellite Clubs project has continued to progress with the two clubs at West Notts College and Bassetlaw now becoming increasingly well established and a new club set up at Bramcote. This means that we are reaching out to new orienteers in three separate areas and we are also providing three club nights for new and existing members in different parts of the County during

most weeks of the year. This project continues to look very promising for our future and it would be remiss of me not to express my gratitude to EMOA for their continued support and guidance throughout the life of the project.

Given these two major initiatives, it is perhaps not surprising that membership numbers are, comparatively, healthy. They are probably the highest we've enjoyed since the 1990s but the average age of members is still increasing and the number of juniors appears to be falling so we still have work to do!

Once again, this year, we will combine our AGM with the Bramcote CATI event and a prize giving for all class winners in the Summer and Winter League, together with the Club Championships. Congratulations to all prize winners and I hope you will be able to attend and personally receive your prize.

The vast majority of the running of the Club and the running of all of our events depends entirely of the good will of people who volunteer. Once again, may I express my gratitude and that of all of the Committee, for everyone's efforts in this regard. It was extremely pleasing to see so many Club members take advantage of the training opportunities in Planning, Organising and Controlling and also to see a number of new coaches being qualified. These are all vital skills for the Club and I hope that all of those who enjoyed the training will feel able to put their newly learned skills into practice.

May I also express my thanks to two outgoing Committee members, the Team Manager, Simon Elliott and Junior Captain, Samuel Horsewill. Simon, in his three year term, has been a major contributor to the Club and the business of the Committee and Samuel has been the inaugural holder of the role of Junior Captain. I am sure that the whole Club is grateful for their efforts.

Given the achievements of this year, I feel very excited about what we can achieve in the coming 12 months. We are working to a clearly set out development plan which, I believe, addresses all of our main ambitions and will ensure that we maintain the progress we have made. As mentioned above, I believe that our new Winter League will be a success and I am confident that we will complete the Sport England project with real and lasting benefits for the Club. I believe that two of our major challenges will be to sustain the benefits of this project, together with the benefits of the Satellite Clubs, long after the funding has dried up. I suspect that this challenge will be a major focus of the Committee's attention during the coming 12 months as we, of course, keep working on building and maintaining the membership of the club.

I believe that we will be offering a fixture list of huge variety, exploiting the many, varied terrains and settings within which orienteering can take place across the County. Most of all, we hope that we can continue to make the

sport enjoyable and rewarding for all members of the Club and wish you all some great orienteering for the next 12 months.
