Jenny Evans – My summer in France

This piece may be a little off topic for this newsletter but our editor thought that it may be nice to have a piece about another aspect of a young orienteers life.

This summer has been the first in as long as I can remember that I have not attended a multiday orienteering event somewhere in Europe. The reason for this was because in November last year I decided that I wanted to do something abroad before starting at university in Sheffield in September. The cost of traveling seemed out of the question given how much I am going to be spending on education in the next four years, so I set about looking for jobs abroad. Fast forward five months and I had secured a job with Canvas Holidays in the Loire Valley in France, from mid April to mid September.

As I write I am sat in my mobile home looking across the campsite which has been my home for the summer, and I can honestly say I've had the best time of my life. I have been working as a campsite courier, so mainly completing cleaning duties and looking after customers (up to 68 families at a time) on a beautiful site in the middle of France. It has been a totally different summer to any that I have had before, including being a customer on these types of holidays, and the work has been tough. However being able to work outside in 30degree heat everyday and go swimming in a beautiful lake after work everyday has made up for all the stressful and bad bits. Working and living with a team of 8 other people has meant we have become like a family and we have managed to see some amazing places including Orleans, Tours and Paris, as well as going to see the Tour de France and doing some exploring on my bike.

As unrelated as this piece is, I honestly believe that had I not been brought up in an adventurous family and packed off on EMJOS weekends and made to run round forests and generally fend for myself when I was little, then I would never have had the guts or confidence to take off to another country with one rucksac and no idea what I was letting myself in for. I've always liked working with people, and anyone who knows me will know that I am not shy but working abroad and fending for myself has made me so confident and ready for growing up and being an adult. I am now getting excited about going to university, and trying to remember how to read a map again, but I'm so glad that having the upbringing that I did, of which NOC and running round forests was a big part of, has enabled me to experience something so fun and worthwhile. Living with Lyme

An apology from the Guest Doctor

I read the article by Richard Robinson with increasing disbelief as to the reluctance of the medical profession to listen to their patient. Yes I know as a doctor that it is increasingly common for patients to present convinced that, having looked their symptoms up on Google, they've got the bubonic plaque .(Despite never having been to Eyam.) However, traditional medical teaching is 'listen to the patient'. I feel really sorry that Richard was so badly let down by all levels of the medical profession and I am even more disappointed when you consider the costs.

Below I've listed the costs of his treatments – all estimates but they won't be far wrong.

GP attendance and blood tests	£100
GP attendance	£60
Kings Mill hospital: ECG and Chest x-ray	£150
A&E attendance	£60
In-patient Kings Mill & blood tests (4 nights):	£1600
Outpatient attendance Nottingham City Hospital	£150

I suspect that this cost is an underestimate and it obviously doesn't include Richard's time off work etc.

Clearly the problem was the inability to reach the diagnosis despite Richards clear guidance as to what the problem was likely to be and the availability of a reasonably specific blood test.

So what was the cost of the definitive blood test? I quote from Rebecca Turner MSc CSci FIBMS PGCert who is the Microbiology Laboratory Manager at my hospital.

"The NHS cost for Lymes serology is **£49.42** which includes IgG and IgM."

I rest my case, LISTEN TO THE PATIENT and save the NHS a fortune!!
