How to decode brown squiggles

When the new M50 in our household mentioned that he wanted us to celebrate his half century by attending a club training weekend in South Wales, my initial reaction was to ask whether he wouldn't rather go out for a Chinese

Training, to my mind, was strictly reserved for the Serious and the Dedicated, the Great and the Good and the Junior Squad and whilst the other members of my family could quite plausibly belong to one or other of those categories, I considered myself to be one of the Untrainable.

Nonetheless, we joined a NOC contingent of some two dozen juniors, a half dozen coaches and about a dozen other club members and were variously accommodated in a Scout Hall or B&B in the Porthcawl area.

Merthyr Mawr is a large area of sand dunes just to the east of Porthcawl. Its particular interest this year was its similarity to the area being used for the JK at Easter and the fact that it would give us a chance to get used to running through thick spiny vegetation with shoes full of sand. Not to mention all those brown squiggly lines which make up most of the map.

Saturday consisted of 2 training sessions, which were intended to familiarise us with this type of terrain and give us a chance to try things out at our own pace. By the end of the afternoon even the Untrainable amongst us were feeling a lot more confident. It had all been a lot of fun, the sun had shone, the views were good and the coaches had been very helpful.

Sunday's Colour Coded event (following a Saturday night in the pub discussing tactics) was on the same area and was the acid test of how much we'd learned (though there's something immensely reassuring about running on a map that you've spent half the previous day staring at!) It was a truly glorious day, I felt fit and supremely confident in my ability to tackle any brown line that reared its squiggly head I sailed effortlessly round 9 controls and then completely lost it!!

Which probably goes to support my initial assumption.....!

Seriously though, it was a very enjoyable weekend and we look forward to getting trained again! Thanks to everyone who planned and organised and made it possible.
