#### A NEW NOC AREA??

Anyone who has come into the sport within the last ten years will probably not have heard of Annesley Forest, the venue for our next colour coded event on 19th April.

In fact, Annesley has been used for orienteering since the early seventies but the last event there was in Spring 1988. The area (shown on the OS map as Morning Springs and High Park Wood) is an interesting one, not typical of other Nottinghamshire forests. Mapper, David Olivant attributes this to the geology of the area, which is not the usual sandstone.

It is a hilly area with brambles in place, so remember your bramble bashers!

The fact that this event is happening at all is due to a few hard working NOC members who re-negotiated access after the death of the previous land owner, who had actively supported orienteering. Additionally, finding a carparking area is a problem and thanks are due to event organiser Tony Donaldson who has worked hard to find a suitable area. Come and run on the 19th and see if the 10 year wait has been worth it!

It goes without saying that if this event is a success and the land owners are happy with orienteering on their land, then it will be a lot easier to negotiate

for future events.
